What is it? (Provide definition)	Skin condition characterized by loose, greasy or dry scales; with or without redness. Generally occurs on the face, scalp, and upper torso. May be caused by stress, fatigue, weather extremes, oily skin, and poor personal hygiene.
Signs and Symptoms (general)	Greasy/oily skin lesions. White and flaky, or yellow and oily scales. Redness, itching, hair loss in affected areas.
Signs and Symptoms (specific to the person):	
Promotion/strategy support required * List very specific steps that the individual and/or caregivers use to support the person's health condition.  Include information about monitoring health status. Who is called for changes/ problems in this person's health condition?  What is tracked, where it can be found, and who follows up on documentation required for this health condition?  Who provides what training for the person and staff about the health condition and when?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Watch <u>(name of person)</u> for signs and symptoms listed above and report to <u>(title of person in agency who is responsible to receive this information)</u>.</li> <li>➤ Give medication as ordered (see Medication Administration Record/Log). If a prn (as needed) medication is given, the result must be documented per agency policy.</li> <li>➤ <u>Include any specific instructions from the treating physician.</u> For example, exposure to sunlight, frequency of shampooing hair</li> <li>➤ Bathe at least once per day, and wash face twice per day with a mild soap.</li> <li>➤ Documentation about this condition can be found in the medical record under <u>(list section here)</u>.</li> <li>➤ Receive training regarding this diagnosis and plan of care (include when to notify the physician) by <u>(title of person who provides medical training)</u> at least <u>(indicate frequency of training)</u> or as changes occur. This should be documented for all staff in the home.</li> </ul>
Frequency of support *	<i>Fill in what physician (e.g. primary care physician, dermatologist) treats this condition and how often the person is seen.</i>
Desired outcome *	To keep condition under control and prevent breakouts
Person/agency responsible *	<u>(Name of person)</u> , caregivers, agency nurse, primary care physician, <u>(specialist, if applicable)</u> <i>(The responsible parties may vary according to your agency; please place specific roles in this section. Some other examples might be health care coordinator, program specialist, house manager.)</i>
