PCHC WELCOMES NEW RESIDENTS!

Jefferson's Doctorate of Occupational Therapy Program Collaborates with PCHC

Beginning September 2018, Philadelphia Coordinated Health Care (PCHC) will collaborate with Jefferson College of Rehabilitation Sciences Department of Occupational Therapy. PCHC will be an inaugural clinical training site location for Jefferson's newest Doctorate of Occupational Therapy (OTD) program. PCHC will host two students during both the Fall 2018 and Spring 2019 semesters.

Goals for this partnership are aimed at advancing the skills of the OT residents by providing opportunities to learn and understand more about the unique needs of a person with an intellectual disability or autism (ID/A). PCHC recognizes the important role an occupational therapist has as a member of the interprofessional team. An occupational therapist practitioner's scope of practice is broad, ranging from supporting a person's activity of daily living skills, developing plans to meet sensory needs, and assisting caregivers who support a person with dementia. PCHC staff have worked with Jefferson Elder Care in the past and more recently provided input on their project "Developing an Evidence-Based Program for Caregivers who Support

PCHC is excited about this endeavor and looks forward to supporting the occupational therapy residents with their goals of integrating academic knowledge and applying the occupational therapy process to take action. This experience will provide the OT residents with advanced skills in research, leadership, advocacy, education, theory development, administration, program and policy development and/or clinical practice skills while focusing on projects specific to ID/A. PCHC hopes to contribute to their education and experience as well as benefit from their research and findings to better support people with ID/A.

Community Health Choices and What You Need to Know

Community Health Choices (CHC) is a new program statewide for managed long term services and supports for individuals eligible for Medicare and Medical Assistance. Many of the eligible participants are often "Dual Eligible" meaning that they qualify for both Medicare and Medical Assistance. Along with dual eligible, CHC will also include participants with the Aging, Attendant Care and Independence Waivers. This will begin on January 1, 2019 in the Southeastern

region of Pennsylvania and will provide services to more people in the community through the three available Managed Care Organizations (MCO's).

Managed Care Organizations:

- Keystone First
- University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC)
- PA Health and Wellness (Centene)


