PCHC REVIEWS

The **Community Health Review (CHR)** is a review completed by a PCHC Nurse. The person's team completes and forwards a Team Agreement Form to PCHC to request a CHR. Reviews are requested for any number of reasons such as physical health issues, mental health challenges, change in functional status, etc. The review involves a holistic approach—meeting the person, reviewing information received from the team, and reviewing records. A report is developed detailing the information and summarizing health care findings; recommendations are also provided.

The **Integrated Health Clinical Review (IHCR)** is available when teams request assistance in providing support to a person who has a dual diagnosis (mental health challenges and an intellectual disability). The process to request an IHCR varies according to county. This review process begins with a Community Health Review (see above). The IHCR is then scheduled allowing time for the team to work on the recommendations from the CHR. Approximately one month prior to the IHCR, an environmental observation is completed by the Dual Diagnosis Specialist. On the day of the review, the person being reviewed, team members, the PCHC Behavioral Health Team (Psychiatrist, Dual Diagnosis Specialist, Health Systems Navigator) and the PCHC Nurse who completed the CHR, meet to discuss current issues; discuss the status of previous recommendations; answer questions; and clarify information provided. A report is generated with recommendations for the team. A future meeting is held with the person's team and the Health Systems Navigator regarding technical assistance and follow-up of the recommendations.

The **Transition Review** is a review completed by a PCHC Nurse at the request of a particular county/administrative entity. These are reviews for people who are not currently receiving residential services (e.g., they may be living with family while waiting for a residential placement). It is a record review (individual is not seen) which provides pertinent information regarding a person's current health status. A report is produced summarizing health care issues and findings/recommendations and may also include preventive health care screening suggestions. A request for a Transition Review is made via e-mail (a Team Agreement Form is not necessary) to Philadelphia Coordinated Health Care (contact: PCHC Director of Nursing). The review will take place at the supports coordination office or administrative entity office. The supports coordination organization representative and an administrative entity representative will receive the report. The report is provided immediately after the review.
